

# Dynamix leather dye

When your leather seats get cracked or faded, there are alternatives to a full or partial retrim – particularly if the cracking is only superficial, as is often the case.

Northern Ireland-based Dynamix offers a repair service, which brings leather back from the brink, filling the cracks and re-dyeing the trim with dye that's produced to original manufacturer specification. If you have a particular rare coloured leather, or custom trim, then it also offers a colour match service. Likewise, if you have a piece of trim that needs a colour change, then Dynamix can do that, too.

Prices start at £50 for a steering wheel and the Editor is thinking of sending his faded Momo over for the treatment.
